Literacy Enhancement

- 26,000 urban grade school and junior high students expanded their understanding of agriculture through our Part 1, 2 & 3 Ag In the Classroom visits.
- 800 third grade children attended Ag Days in Schaumburg and in Chicago to gain first hand knowledge about farms and food.
- 55 children filled our Passport to the Farm Camp for 4 half days this July, "hands-on" agricultural experience.
- 200 youth attended our Ag Olympic-themed library programs this summer.



Leadership Development

- 26 outstanding urban students were selected for the Ag Leadership Academy by their teachers to experience a day of discovering agricultural career possibilities.
- 61 High School student entrepreneurs started up their own ag-related small business and presented their results to a panel of funders upon completion.
- 2 college interns majoring in agriculture joined us to teach ag education in Cook County.



Learning

- 9 scholarship member recipients received \$16,500 in scholarship funds to aid in their pursuit of a farm & food related career.
- 20 teachers representing Grades K-12 attended Summer Ag Institute 1 to learn ways to bring farm and food education back to the classrooms of Cook County.
- 200 educators attended workshops this year to learn how to incorporate agriculture into their existing science, socials studies and reading curriculums.
