INTERNSHIP

Our Foundation supported Ag Literacy summer internship combined virtual and onsite responsibilities for Illinois State University student Emily Lopata. Her many accomplishments over the summer included the revision of our Teacher Resource mAGic Learning Kits, several social media campaigns, video content development for 2021-22 education and extensive youth programming. Our internship provides guided exposure to all aspects of Ag Literacy including adult and youth outreach throughout the county.



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

We were excited to begin our virtual year speaking with teachers about our AITC resources as part of the Prairie State Career Prep Network PD and end of year resource overview through an ISTA teacher PD. Ag Literacy offered a virtual workshop in honor of Earth Day where educators learned about the importance of the environment to farming, along with lessons on soil, water, and related topics. Through a partnership with IL AITC, local and state teachers were able to attend monthly professional development workshops titled PD's in Your PJ's that were offered one Saturday a month.

EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH

Programming went beyond our traditional classroom programs with requests by a variety of organizations and educators. Ag Literacy education was shared with after school culinary clubs, Family & Consumer Courses, the Chicagoland Girls Scouts and a wide variety of virtual field trips for families.

Our CCFB Young Leaders adopted a local 3rd Grade Classroom in Bedford Park this year and provided virtual lessons and activities on agriculture to this enthusiastic group of local students.





FARM SHADOW & CAREER EDUCATION

Due to increased demand for middle and high school agriculture career partnerships, the Foundation supported the development of a Farm Shadow Program that began this year. The program provides a virtual school presentation by an agriculture professional to students who may be interested in exploring a future job in our industry. Featured speakers this year included a small animal veterinarian, a food science educator who spoke of various careers within the food chemistry/flavoring industry, and a marketing director for an ag organization. The Farm Shadow and Ag Careers programs strive to attract our area's enthusiastic, bright minds to seek agricultural careers through this program.



2021 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

CCFB Foundation has provided over \$270,000 in scholarships since its inception in 1999. Scholarship recipients were selected to receive the scholarships for the 2020-2021 school year based on exceptional academic ability, financial need, demonstrated interest in agriculture, evidence of self-help, focus on an agriculturally related need and overall character.

The Foundation Board distributed \$16,000 to college bound member dependents in 2021. Each of these students pictured is planning on seeking an agriculturally related career. The Howard Paarlberg Excellence in Agriculture Scholarship carries the highest financial award and is given to the top-rated applicant.
